IMPACT 2023

The Community Impact Program is a 7-month program where youth are taught 7 out of 17 United Nations Sustainable Goals (UNSDGs). Every month we teach through play one UN SDG that directly affects young people in different communities. We've been able to work with 3 schools (Vision Daycare, House of God, and Brainswealth) from Mukuru and its environment.

The Football academy has presently conducted a total of 171 sessions this year, distributed across various locations:

Women Up

We work with women and girls to eradicate all forms of gender inequalities through Sports.

Impact 2023

The Women-Up program impacted 141 girls aged between 7 and 15 years. 29 were reached at Vision Daycare, 28 at Brainswealth and House of God, 48 at A Place for Grace, and 37 at Huruma grounds. The program anticipates increasing the number of participants in 2024, further empowering more girls and women in informal settlements.

IMPACT 2023

We collaborated with four organizations in Nairobi, initiating the training with Green-Kenya coaches. The program involved a total of 71 coaches, comprising 52 males and 19 females. These coaches, in turn, had a significant impact on a total of 3,367 children, with 1,057 being girls and 2,310 being boys





